Brethren, the theme for this year is "Planting the Seeds of Success – Family,

As Masons, many of us are involved with Concordant Bodies, each with their own philanthropic activities: the Scottish Rite – language clinics; the Shrine – crippled and burned children. But what can we do as Blue Lodge Masons to make an impact on the Community in which we live.

The Masonic Renewal Committee of North America published a workbook with dozens of ideas for community involvement. Here are just a few which we, as individual Masons or as a Lodge, might consider for this term and ongoing:


- ? ? Paint Patrol identify objects in the community that can use a coat of paint, clean and paint them. Don't forget the "Wet Paint" signs.
- ? ? Food Drive collect food for local service agencies
- ? ? Feed the Poor assist at a homeless shelter
- ? ? **Volunteer to Read** develop a reading center with the local library and volunteer as readers for children who visit the library.
- ? ? **Build a Play Area** identify an area in the local community or on the school grounds and plan to build and donate a safe play area for kids. Hayward Rotary has just done this downtown.
- ? ? Art Exhibit Arrange an exhibit or fair for local artists to display and sell their works. Consider making it an annual event and get judges to select the best in different categories and award prizes. Expand to include crafts if it goes well.
- ? ? Charity Begins at Home Volunteer at the Masonic Home
- ? Essay Contest Sponsor a major essay or writing contest for kids of different ages. Arrange for prize and to have the winning entries published. Contact local schools or colleges for assistance. Consider Memorial Day or 4th of July as possibilities.

These are just some of the ways we can get involved in the community as individual Masons or as a lodge. If any of these things are especially exciting to you, perhaps you would like to coordinate getting it started in our Lodge.


